

VEHICLE SAFETY: CAR SEAT RECOMMENDATIONS

Using the correct car seat can be a literal lifesaver. It is important to make sure your child is always buckled in an age- and size-appropriate car seat or booster seat.

The color coding on the chart below will help you to determine which type of seat is best for your child. If you have questions about car seat use, the installation of a seat, or are in need of a car seat, please reach out to your community worker.



Rear-Facing Car Seat



Birth to Age 2*

Buckle children in a rear-facing seat until age 2 or when they reach the upper weight or height limit of that seat.

Forward-Facing Car Seat



Birth to Age 5*

When children outgrown their rearfacing seat, use a forward-facing car seat until they reach the upper weight or height limit.

IMPORTANT REMINDERS

Never place a rear-facing car seat in front of an air bag. Children 12 and under should always be in the back seat. **Booster Seat**



5 until Seat Belts fit properly*

Once they've outgrown their forward-facing car seat, children should be buckled in a booster seat until seat belts fit properly. Recommended height for seat belt use is 57 inches tall.

Seat Belt



Once seat belts fit properly

Children may use only a seat belt once they fit them properly. This means the lap belt lays across the upper thighs (not on the stomach) and the shoulder belt is across the chest (not the neck).

*Recommended age ranges for each seat type vary to account for differences in child growth and height/weight limits of car seats and booster seats. Use the owner's manual to check installation and seat height/weight limits.


